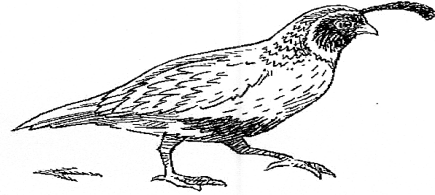

To Recycle or Not To Recycle: what really goes in those big blue rolling bins?

We all recycle, have been doing so for years, but things in the recycling industry change and if you are new to Prescott what you did in your former home may not be the same as what we do here. I recently talked with a representative of the city recycling center to clarify some things about what is recyclable and here is what she said.

Metal - Aluminum foil, metal cans (both steel and aluminum), frozen dinner trays, pie plates, aerosol cans, wire coat hangers and small (emphasis on small) appliances. Be certain you give the cans, trays, etc. a good rinse. They don't have to be washed with soap.

Plastic - Hard plastic only, any container numbered 1 - 7 on the bottom. **However, the plastic caps and pumps are not recyclable and must go in the regular trash.** Remember to remove the top from aerosol cans too. The plastic bags we get from the grocery, Wal-Mart, Home Depot, etc. are **not** recyclable and must be put in the regular trash. Most of the large stores have a bin where they can be recycled.

Magazines and Books - Glue bound and stapled are okay but how about giving them to the *Friends of the Library* instead. Paperback and hard back books are not recyclable and they should also go the *Friends*. This helps fund your library and is a great way to recycle.

Glass - All glass is recyclable but only at the transfer station so set those bottles and jars aside in a container you can fit in your car and make a run periodically. A good thing would be if several neighbors got together and made a trip once a month or so.

Newspapers and Mail – Newspapers are recyclable but you can also take them to the bins at most grocery stores for the *Lions Club* and at the *Recycling Center*. Mail, including that pesky junk mail, is recyclable even if the envelopes have windows or are self-sealing. Paper of any color is recyclable.

Milk Cartons – For those of us who purchase milk in the cardboard/waxed cartons, they are not recyclable and neither are the caps.

Cardboard – As long as it is flattened, clean and will fit in the bin can be recycled. The cardboard does not have to be bagged. If you have several boxes or pieces of cardboard (from moving for instance) it should be taken directly to the Transfer Station on Sundog Ranch Road. You can also recycle moving cartons by calling local moving companies.

In some places having one incorrect item in the recyclable bins would cause the entire truckload to be rejected. At least that is the story. Since our trucks off-load their pickups at the transfer station into big containers which are taken south, it is unlikely that this happens. But, that does not mean you should not be diligent about placing only recyclable items in your blue bin. Remember, you do not have to separate items but they do all have to be bagged.

Ideally, we should all have to put full blue bins at the curb each week and perhaps only one large bag of "trash" in the green bin. If you have any other questions about whether something is recyclable or not you can call the Recycling Center at 777-1116.

We have confirmation of the date for our Holiday Party that benefits Stepping Stones.

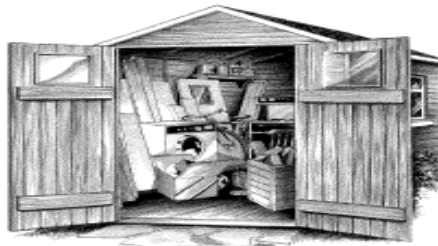
Please mark your calendars for December 7th. We will have our luncheon in the Arizona room of the Hassayampa Hotel.
