## Did you know?

Our Bylaws have been updated. Here is what has changed. Section 1.2 has been removed.

2.1c & 2.1d – dates added

Section 5.3 of original removed – obsolete

5.10 of original now 5.9 added the following: A Director that has been removed from the Board of Directors, will not be eligible to serve again on the Board for a period of 5 years after the date of removal. If a director misses more than 2 consecutive meetings or 3 meetings in a calendar year, the Board of Directors may remove the Director. The director may be removed only if a majority of the Directors in office vote for the removal.

## Defensible Space

Do you have defensible space around your home? Defensible space is essential to improve your home's chance of surviving a wildfire. This is the buffer you create between a building on your property and the common area that meets your property line. This space is needed to slow or stop the spread of wildfire and will protect your home from embers, direct flames or radiant heat. How do you do this? Use hardscape, remove dead and dying vegetation, and limit combustibile items on your property.
